Parental support for the day was excellent, with all our new parents in attendance for the first day, where they could dip in to a fun Science lesson and enjoy a complementary lunch with their children.

This is the first year we have had a full intake in to Year 7 at Birch Wood Vale, highlighting our growing popularity. We also now have waiting list for most years groups at both sites.

Birch Wood Vale offers a small, nurturing school combined with the opportunities available in a varied secondary model curriculum for students with multiple learning difficulties on the moderate learning difficulty spectrum. We have high aspirations for all our students with the chance to access accredited courses in Key Stage 4 including GCSEs, alongside support into employability and life long independence.

Our secondary high functioning Autism provision 'The Nook' at Birch Wood Vale provides yet another layer of support and specializes in meeting the needs of students who require an individualized package that is designed around their needs, skills and abilities.
